<b>DECIDUOUS TREES &amp; SHRUBS</b>				
	<b>American Cranberrybush*</b> : (aka. Highbush Cranberry) The fruit can be used in jelly and is great for attracting birds. 8-12' multi-stemmed shrub.	18-24"	\$6.00	
	<b>Red Oak*</b> : The Red Oak is a great timber tree. This tree tolerates full sun and polluted environments. It prefers sandy soils.	1-2'	\$6.00	
	<b>Sargent Crabapple</b> : Densely branched 6-8' tree. Fruit edible to humans and wildlife. White flowers those are red in bud.	18-24"	\$6.00	
	<b>Serviceberry*</b> : 6-20' erect suckering multistemmed small tree. White flowers. Enjoyed by birds and other wildlife. Thrives in moist well-drained, acid soils.	18-24"	\$6.00	
	<b>Silky Dogwood*</b> : Silky Dogwood is a favorite for attracting birds. It thrives in moist and wet soils.	1-2'	\$6.00

	<b>Black-Eyed Susan</b> : Bright golden-yellow daisy-like flowers with dark button eyes.	2" Pot	\$1.50	
	<b>Blue Vervain</b> : Stiff, pencil-like spikes of numerous small, tubular, blue-violet flowers. Likes moderately fertile, well-drained soil in a sunny position.	2" Pot	\$1.50	
	<b>Boneset</b> : Likes moist woods and thickets; swamps, Ht: 2-4 feet, flowerheads around 1/4" across, in large, flat clusters, color: white, or rarely purple, flowers in July to October.	2" Pot	\$1.50	
	<b>Cardinal Flower</b> : Requires moist, rich soil and responds well to cultivation. Pollinated by hummingbirds, best in partial shade. May require replanting every few years.	2" Pot	\$1.50	
	<b>Great Lobelia</b> : swamps, wet meadows, wet woods, Ht: 1-3', 1 inch long blue-purple flowers, Flowering time: August to September.	2" Pot	\$1.50	
	<b>Joe-Pye Weed</b> : Perfect for planting along streambanks and pond edges Ht: 4-6'. Butterflies find it irresistible, best in full sun with moist soil, tolerates some shade.	2" Pot	\$1.50	
	<b>Juniper, Bar Harbor</b> : a very low-growing, spreading groundcover, full sun to partial shade, slightly sandy & acidic to well-drained, also does well in rocky soils.	Gallon	\$9.00	
	<b>Rhododendron, Big Leaved</b> : A mid to late season bloomer. Hardy, sun tolerant plant. Has a compact growth habit with shiny dark green leaves. Tight trusses of 3 inch flowers.	Gallon	\$9.00	
	<b>Paper Birch</b> : Paper birch grows in a wide variety of conditions, from full sun to moderate shade, and from dry soils to moist ones -- will not tolerate waterlogging.	Fiber	\$14.00
