Item #	Descriptions of Flowers Offered	(see order form)
<b>01 Allium Caeruleum</b>	Fragrant variety with 1-2" blue blooms resulting in a sphere. Great for pollinators! Deer & rodent resistant. Full to half sun. Blooms early summer. Ht.: 14-16" HZ: 2-10	
<b>02 Drumstick Allium</b>	Easy to grow variety with egg shaped, cranberry colored flowering heads. Makes great cut or dried flowers! Deer & rodent resistant. Full to half sun. Blooms early summer. Ht.: 20-24" HZ: 2-10	
<b>03 Large Flowering Crocus Mix</b>	Use in borders; group together for naturalizing. Assortment of purples, whites and yellows. Great for pollinators! Full to partial sun. Blooms in early spring. Ht.: 4-6" HZ: 3-9	
<b>04 Orange Monarch Crocus</b>	Grass-like foliage surrounds this deep orange blossom. Outside of petals have a burnt orange hue, lending to a vibrant orange on the inside. Extremely hardy, will blossom through the snow! Full sun to partial shade. Blooms early spring. Ht.: 3-4" HZ: 3-9	
<b>05 Carnegie Hyacinth</b>	A creamy white dense spike of fragrant florets surrounded by green sword-like foliage. Great for walkways! Prefers well-drained soil in full sun/partial shade. Blooms mid spring. Ht.: 10-12" HZ: 2-10	
<b>06 Delft Blue Hyacinth</b>	A beautiful soft blue array of star-like florets surrounding a sturdy stem. One of the most fragrant flowers and very popular in New England. Full sun to partial shade. Blooms mid spring. Ht.: 10-12" HZ: 2-10	
<b>07 Sapphire Beauty Dutch Iris</b>	Upright stems support a delicate array of sapphire blue petals with yellow centers. A great cut flower! For best results, layer with mulch for winter. Full sun. Blooms early summer. Ht.: 20-24" HZ: 5-10	
<b>08 Dwarf Iris Mix</b>	Low height mix of purples, pale and deep blues, and yellow. Plant 4" deep and 4" apart for best results. Deer & rodent resistant. Full sun. Blooms in early April. Ht.: 4-6" HZ: 2-10	
<b>09 Pink Giant Chionodoxa</b>	Also known as "Glory of the Snow." Pale pink, star-like flowers. Deer resistant and a great naturalizer. One of the first flowers to bloom in the early spring. Full sun, partial shade. Ht.: 6-8" HZ: 2-8	
<b>10 Peppermint Grape Hyacinth Muscari</b>	Also known as "delft blue mixed muscari. Deep cobalt, periwinkle, and light airy blues, the colors in this mix will not disappoint! Will naturalize and multiply. Full to partial sun. Blooms mid spring. Ht.: 4-8" HZ: 3-9	
<b>11 Giant Snowdrops</b>	Reminiscent of Lily of the Valley but flowers are more visible, these dainty white flowers resemble clusters of small white bells hanging from their stems. Deer & rodent resistant. Blooms in late spring. Ht.: 14-16" HZ: 4-10	
<b>12 Pipit Narcissus</b>	Vivid yellow petals surround a white trumpet. A dainty looking flower. Deer resistant. Full to partial sun. Blooms mid spring. Ht.: 12-14" HZ: 2-10	
<b>13 Dutch Master Daffodil</b>	Most popular of all large, yellow daffodils. Excellent for large landscaping jobs. Great for pollinators! Fragrant. Deer & rodent resistant. Full to partial sun. Blooms in April. Ht.: 14-16" HZ: 2-10	
<b>14 Tête à Tête Specialty Daffodil</b>	A beautiful miniature flower head of yellow with a golden yellow cup. Deer resistant and fragrant! Blooms early spring. Ht.: 6-8" HZ: 2-10	
<b>15 Cheerfulness Double Flowering Narcissus</b>	White petals with a partial white/partial yellowy-orange center. Double petals and a double trumpet make for an appealing addition to your garden! Full to partial sun, blooms mid spring. Ht.: 14-16" HZ: 2-10	
<b>16 Apricot Foxx Triumph Tulip</b>	A gorgeous flower with shades of oranges, almost resembling a peach. Great cut flower. Full to partial sun. Blooms mid spring. Ht.: 18-20" HZ: 2-8	
<b>17 Lucky Strike Triumph Tulip</b>	A large flower made of red petals with white tips and edges on a sturdy stem. Striking along a walkway. Full sun to partial shade. Blooms mid spring. Ht.: 20-22" HZ: 2-8	

<b>18 Rosalie Triumph Tulip</b> – Pale pink petals, offering a dainty and feminine look to any garden. Full to partial shade. Blooms mid spring. Ht.: 18-20” HZ: 2-8
<b>19 Nightrider Tulip</b> – An exciting variety with green petals with vibrant magenta edges. Full sun to partial shade. Blooms late spring. Ht.: 18-20” HZ: 2-8
<b>20 Apricot Impression Darwin Hybrid Tulip</b> – Sword-like foliage on a sturdy stem supports a vibrant orange/pink flower head. A wonderful cut flower. Full to partial sun. Blooms mid spring. Ht.: 20-22” HZ: 2-8
<b>21 Hakuun Darwin Hybrid Tulip</b> – A wonderful white tulip. Very easy to grow. Blooms mid spring. Ht.: 20-24” HZ: 2-8
<b>22 Pink Impression Darwin Hybrid Tulip</b> – Beautiful deep pink petals on a sturdy stem. Full sun will make the color more vibrant while planting in partial shade will ensure a longer blooming period. Blooms mid spring. Ht.:20-22” HZ: 2-8
<b>23 Purple Peony Double Late Tulip</b> – A beautiful variety with a double bloom giving it the look of petit peony. Vibrant purple petals. Full to partial sun. Blooms late spring. Ht.: 16-18” HZ: 2-8
<b>24 Lebanon Squill</b> – Delicate white petals with blue veins. Great at naturalizing. Full to partial sun. Blooms early spring. Ht.: 4-6” HZ: 3-10
<b>25 Hardneck “Duganski” Garlic</b> – More similar to a wild garlic than the kind found in a grocery store. Distinctive taste that becomes milder when cooking. Stores well for 6-9 months. Full sun. Harvest in summer. HZ: 3-9
<b>Bulb Fertilizer</b> – A mild organic fertilizer. A 3.5 lb. bag will cover 87.5 square feet. “9-9-6” variety
