2019 Fall Bulb Sale**

Item #	Descriptions of Flowers Offered	(see order form)
01 Allium Caeruleum	- Fragrant variety with 1-2" blue blooms resulting in a sphere. Great for pollinators! Deer & rodent resistant. Full to half sun. Blooms early summer. Ht.: 14-16" HZ: 2-10	
02 Drumstick Allium	- Easy to grow variety with egg shaped, cranberry colored flowering heads. Makes great cut or dried flowers! Deer & rodent resistant. Full to half sun. Blooms early summer. Ht.: 20-24" HZ: 2-10	
03 Mount Everest Allium	- A dramatic Allium providing statuesque garden architecture. 6" wide, snow white globes. Deer & rodent resistant. Full to half sun. Blooms early summer. Ht.: 36" HZ 5-8	
04 Large Flowering Crocus Mix	- Use in borders; group together for naturalizing. Assortment of purples, whites and yellows. Great for pollinators! Full to partial sun. Blooms in early spring. Ht.: 4-6" HZ: 3-9	
05 Remembrance vernus Crocus	- A corm that is primarily native to high alpine areas in Europe. Each corm produces several upright, cup-like, violet-purple flowers with a silvery gloss. Full to half sun. Blooms early spring. HT.: 4-5" HZ: 3-8	
06 Delft Blue Hyacinth	- A beautiful soft blue array of star-like florets surrounding a sturdy stem. One of the most fragrant flowers and very popular in New England. Full sun to partial shade. Blooms mid spring. Ht.: 10-12" HZ: 2-10	
07 Pink Sunrise Hyacinth (Muscari)	- Also known as "Glory of the Snow." Pale pink, star-like flowers. Deer resistant and a great naturalizer. One of the first flowers to bloom in the early spring. Full sun, partial shade. Ht.: 6-8" HZ: 2-8	
08 Blue Chionodoxa	- Commonly called glory-of-the-sun, it is among the first bulbs to bloom, often poking up through melting snows. Full sun to partial shade. Blooms early spring. Ht.: 6-12" HZ: 3-8	
09 Giant Snowdrops	- Reminiscent of Lily of the Valley but flowers are more visible, these dainty white flowers resemble clusters of small white bells hanging from their stems. Deer & rodent resistant. Blooms in late spring. Ht.: 14-16" HZ: 4-10	
10 Double Snowdrops	- Produces masses of ruffled white and emerald-green blooms. Easy to grow in moist well-drained soil. Full sun to partial shade. Blooms early spring. Ht.: 4-6" HZ: 3-9	
11 Iris Rock Garden Mixture	- Low height mix of purples, pale and deep blues, and yellow. Plant 4" deep and 4" apart for best results. Deer & rodent resistant. Full sun. Blooms in early April. Ht.: 4-6" HZ: 2-10	
12 English Bluebells	- Grass-like basal foliage supports upright stems with clusters of mini bell shaped flowers. Deer resistant. Full to partial sun. Blooms late spring. Ht.: 10-12" HZ: 2-10	
13 Fritillaria Michailovskyi	- This Turkish native has up to five pendant, bell-shaped dark reddish-purple flowers edged prominently in golden-yellow with grass-like foliage. Deer and rodent resistant. Full to partial sun. Blooms mid spring. Ht.: 8" HZ: 4-8	
14 Dutch Master Daffodil	- Most popular of all large, yellow daffodils. Excellent for large landscaping jobs. Great for pollinators! Fragrant. Deer & rodent resistant. Full to partial sun. Blooms in April. Ht.: 14-16" HZ: 2-10	
15 Scarlett O'Hara Daffodil	- This large-cupped variety has striking yellow blooms with a dark yellow center. Deer resistant. Full to partial sun. Blooms mid spring. Ht.: 12-14" HZ: 2-10	
16 Double Poet's Daffodil	- This interesting flower will add a special touch to any garden or landscape. Deer resistant. Full to partial sun. Blooms late spring. Ht.: 16-18" HZ: 2-10	
17 Apricot Whirl Split Corona Narcissus	- The split corona opens in a swirl of salmon-pink against a background of luminous white petals. Sun to partial sun. Blooms mid spring. Ht.: 14-16" HZ: 2-10	

18 Pink Charm Narcissus – The epitome of charming. Six creamy white petals form perianths with a white corona edged in a beautiful, modern shade of coral. Orange toned in some gardens and pink in others. Full sun to partial shade. Blooms early to mid spring. Ht.: 14-16” HZ: 2-10
19 Beauty of Apeldoorn Darwin Hybrid Tulip – Displays impressive, egg-shaped, golden-orange flowers adorned with delicate red flames. Full sun. Blooms mid spring. Ht.: 20-22” HZ: 2-8
20 Apricot Impression Darwin Hybrid Tulip – Sword-like foliage on a sturdy stem supports a vibrant orange/pink flower head. A wonderful cut flower. Full to partial sun. Blooms mid spring. Ht.: 20-22” HZ: 2-8
21 Kansas Proud Triumph – Velvety and luxurious in color which deepens with age. A white base fanning out into deeper hues of purple. Full sun and partial shade. Blooms mid spring. Ht.: 18-20” HZ: 2-8
22 Lucky Strike Triumph Tulip – An eye-catching pink tulip with white trimmed tips. Great for cut flowers. Full to half sun. Blooms in mid spring. Ht.: 20-22” HZ: 2-8
23 Purple Peony Double Late Tulip – A beautiful variety with a double bloom giving it the look of petit peony. Vibrant purple petals. Full to partial sun. Blooms late spring. Ht.: 16-18” HZ: 2-8
24 Tulip Shirley Single Late – Shirley opens yellow with raspberry-red highlights and then magically morphs to ivory-white with ever-changing edges and flecks of purple. Blooms in April. Ht.: 22” HZ: 3-8
25 Elegant Lady Lily Flowering – Has slim, pointy petals that are about the color of butter cream frosting with a pale pink overlay. Full sun. Blooms mid to late spring. Ht.: 16-20” HZ: 3-8
26 Flaming Parrot – Big, beautiful and bold with a variegated yellow and red pattern gracing its ruffled, textured petals. Full to half sun. Blooms late spring. Ht.: 18-22” HZ: 2-8
27 Tulip Species Wildflower Mixture – Fragrant, chalice shaped flowers surrounded by grass-like foliage. Deer resistant. Full sun to partial shade. Blooms early spring. Ht.: 4-6” HZ: 2-10
28 Lebanon Squill – Delicate white petals with blue veins. Great at naturalizing. Full to partial sun. Blooms early spring. Ht.: 4-6” HZ: 3-10
29 Liliun Sunny Morning Martagon – Consists of pendant, bright lemon-yellow Turk’s Cap flowers with brick-red markings, smooth brick-red spots and elegant, gold-anther-tipped, pale ivory-green stamens. Blooms late spring. Ht.: 4-6” HZ: 3-8
30 Hardneck “Duganski” Garlic – More similar to a wild garlic than the kind found in a grocery store. Distinctive taste that becomes milder when cooking. Stores well for 6-9 months. Full sun. Harvest in summer. HZ: 3-9
